COVID RESTRICTIONS:

For the safety of our audience and cast we have had to update our Covid-19 policies. Ticketholders must be fully vaccinated against Covid-19. If you are visiting the theater 14 days after your final vaccine dose you must bring a photo ID and proof of vaccination, either your physical vaccination card, a picture of the card, or a digital vaccination record. Guests under the age of 12 or those who need an accommodation for medical reasons must provide proof of a negative Covid-19 PCR test taken 72 hours prior to entering the theater. Children under 5 will not be admitted. Masks are required of all ticketholders, regardless of vaccination status, and must be worn at all times except when eating or drinking. Free masks will be available at the theater.
